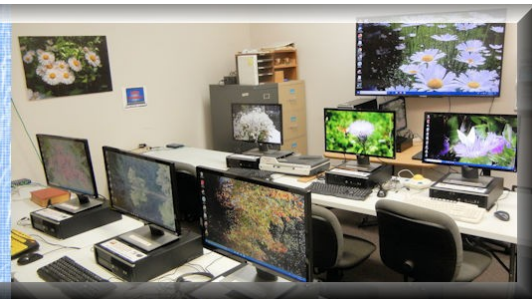

When a YouTube video is open, check to see how long it is and check to see if it has chapters.



Note the YouTube tools.

- The time line will show the current **Location**.
- Next to the Location is the total video **Length**.

➤ Next to the Length tool is the **Chapter** tool (if the video includes chapters). If you select the Chapters tool, a chapter list will appear. The length of each chapter is shown and you can jump to the different chapters by clicking a chapter in the list.

➤ Pressing **F** on the keyboard toggles full screen view on or off.

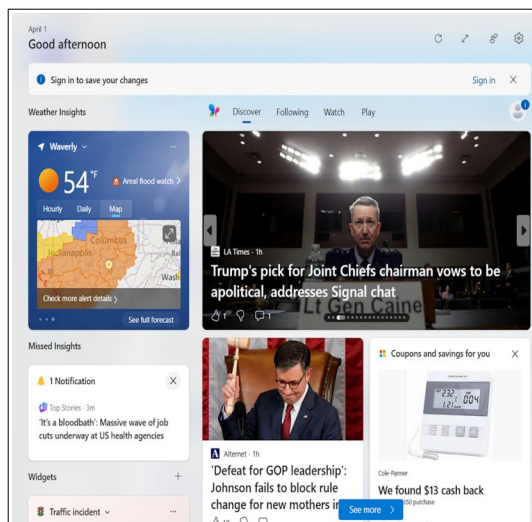

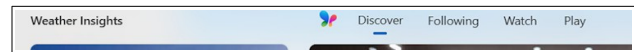

Windows Widgets

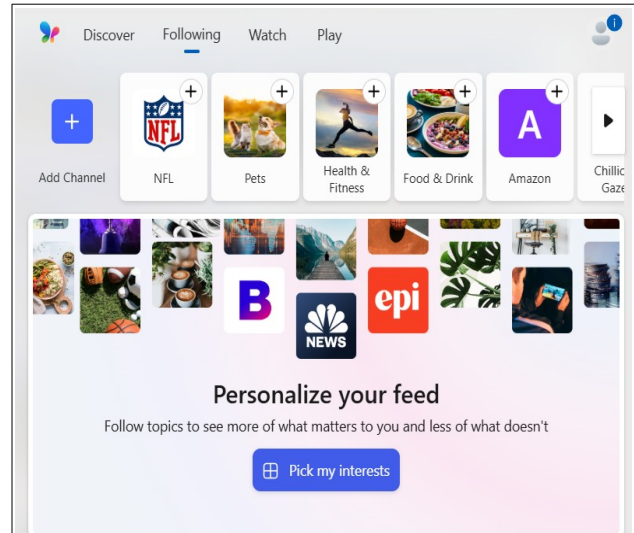
Widgets are interactive elements that display information from apps on your device's home screen, lock screen, or taskbar. They can be used to view weather, news, reminders, and more. Widgets can be found on smart phones, tablets, or in this case, Windows.



To open Windows widgets in Windows 11, press **Windows key + W**.

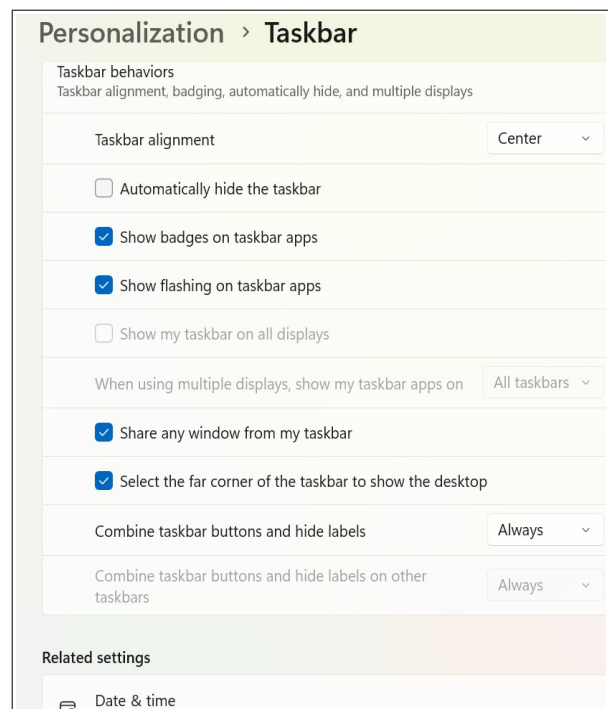


Pick an option from the Widget menu to display different selections. The Following menu choice allows you to personalize your feed.



Windows widgets can help with your web browsing. To close the widgets simply click somewhere away from the widgets.

Personalize Windows 11 Taskbar



The **Taskbar** is the horizontal row of icons along the bottom of the Windows 11 display. The Taskbar provides one click access to Apps. To personalize the taskbar, **right click** on an empty part of the Taskbar and select **Taskbar Settings**. This will open the Personalize Taskbar dialog box.

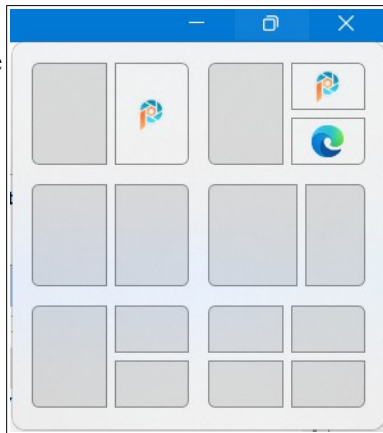
Right click on a Taskbar App shortcut to open options for that app.

To add an app shortcut to the Taskbar first open the **Start** menu. You can **right click** on a start menu shortcut App and select **Pin to Taskbar**. If the desired App does not appear in the Shortcut Pinned display, select **All**, scroll down to the desired App, **right click**, select **More**, and select **Pin to Taskbar**.

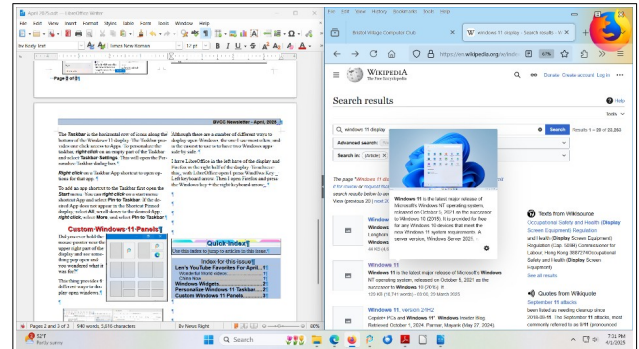
Custom Windows 11 Panels

Did you ever hold the mouse pointer near the upper right part of the display and see something pop open and you wondered what it was for?

This thing provides 6 different ways to display open windows.



Although there are a number of different ways to display open Windows, the one I use most often, and is the easiest to use is to have two Windows apps side by side.



I have LibreOffice in the left half of the display and Firefox in the right half of the display. To achieve this, with LibreOffice open I press Windows Key + Left keyboard arrow. Then I open Firefox and press the Windows key + the right keyboard arrow.

This makes it quicker and easier to copy from a Firefox window and paste the copy in the LibreOffice document.

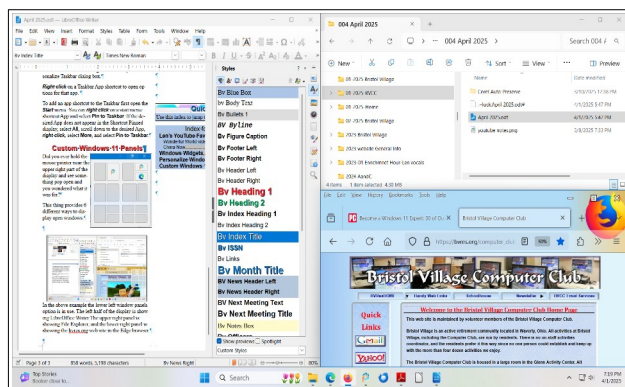
