Make Text Larger Windows Text

To make text larger in Windows, select **Start**, **Settings**, **Accessibility**, **Text Size**.



In the Accessibility, Text Size dialog box, drag the text size slider o the desired size.

NOTE: If you make the text size too large, some applications windows may not fit on the display. This can be a problem if the window has button for Save.

In email messages

Some email messages have a font hat is too small to read. Try pressing **Ctrl +** to increase the text size. Press **Ctrl-** to reduce the text size.

In web browser pages

This works for Firefox, Edge, and Google Chrome. Press **Ctrl +** to increase the text size. Press **Ctrl-** to reduce the text size. *****

Add an emoji to your text

Emojis are those little pictures like this.



In Windows, place he text cursor where you would like t add an emoji. Hold the Windows key down and then press the period key.

This will open the Emoji and more dialog box.



Use the scroll bar or the > buttons to reveal more emojis. Simply select (left click on) an emoji to add it to your text. Be sure to close the emoji dialog box or you will get multiple emojis. \bigcirc \bigcirc \bigcirc



Copy and paste graphics

Hopefully, all of you are using the Copy Ctrl C and Paste Ctrl V tricks to save typing time by copying and pasting text from one app to another. Did you know that you can also copy and paste graphics?

Try it. Let's say you are in the middle of composing an email message and you decide to add a graphic image to you message. Don't close your email app. Select the *Start* button and open the app where your image is found. *Right click* on the image. Select **Copy image** from the pop up context menu. This places the image in the invisible clip board. Now use **Alt Tab** to return to your message. Or, select the email app from the taskbar. Press **Ctrl+V** to paste the image.
